Put Christ back into Christmass

The Minister writes:

S o here we are: 11 years as Assistant Minister, Acting Minister and latterly Minister; 25 years as Church Secretary (which I have been doing alongside Ministering these last years); 25 years on the Diaconate; 30 years as a church member. And on 31st December I retire!



It's the right time. Ten years ago I retired at 60 from a full time job in education. I had lots of plans. But then my predecessor as minister, who was having increasing health problems, had to retire at the same time and I suddenly found myself up to the neck in the affairs of PCC.

To be fair I had been heavily involved before then but I had expected to have plenty of time for those plans.

The thing is, you see, God has plans for us all which do not necessarily coincide with our own!

When I did the **Congregational Federation's training course**, I had thought I was mainly doing it to expand my own spiritual relationship with God. He had other ideas: he had a purpose for me. And, when the situation arose where the church suddenly found itself without a minister or the resources to employ another one from scratch, I realised what that purpose was.

Now I'm not telling you this so you can think about my nobility in abandoning my plans and following God's. As Christians, we all listen for God's voice and we all thrill when we realise he has a purpose for us. And as members of a church, the Body of Christ, the family of Christ, we are on the lookout all the time for ways in which we can identify the needs, not just of our church family, but also of those around us who don't know Jesus.

In **Colossians 3**, Paul tells us that "since God chose you to be the holy people whom he loves, you must clothe yourself with tender-hearted mercy, kindness, humility, gentleness and patience.

"You must make allowance for each other's faults and forgive the person who offends you. Remember the Lord *forgave you, so you must forgive others.*

"And the most important piece of clothing you must wear is love."

I am a member of the family that is Penge Congregational Church; PCC had a need and I felt God calling me to answer that need. Others within our church family do that as well; it just so happens that being minister is a role that people notice more than the needs being quietly met by others. I feel I have done the work God called me to do, and now it's time to step back and allow others to follow God's direction and take PCC to its next level. I'm not disappearing. I hope the church will allow me to remain a church member and even, after a suitable length of time, to let PCC become comfortable in its new ways, to join you occasionally on a Sunday morning as a member of the congregation. I shall certainly be keeping in touch with individuals who have been family for so long.

My church family has loved me and supported me for all these 30 years and I have done my best to love and support you too.

We are all about to walk in new ways: me as a retired person, you as a church looking forward to doing something new. The immediate future for us all may seem a little foggy and uncertain, but God our Father is there for all of us.

The prophet **Isaiah** said this (Chapter 26, verses 3-4): **"You will keep in perfect peace those whose minds are steadfast because they trust in you.**

Trust in the Lord forever, for the Lord, the Lord himself, is the Rock eternal."

Letter to the Editor

am writing to you as editor of the PCC Newsletter which I still receive, as you asked if anyone knew about 'The Policy of Girlguiding' following the Rev'd Pam Owen's comment in her Minister's letter (see the November 2023 issue).

Firstly, the Girlguiding Promise changed some years ago and the wording is:

"I promise that I will do my best,

To be true to myself and develop my beliefs,

To serve the King and my Community, to help other people and to keep the (Brownie) Guide law."

The promise was updated again on the death of our Girlguiding patron the late Queen Elizabeth II and now the word King has replaced Queen.

Girlguiding is open to girls from all backgrounds and beliefs. This includes girls with no faiths or who have non-religious belief system.

Secondly, 'The Policy of Girlguiding' is:

Religious parades are not part of the Girlguiding programme.

No young member should attend a faith-based parade without consent from their parent, guardian or carer, and taking part in any religious act must always be voluntary. I have been a member of Girlguiding as a Brownie, Guide, Sea Ranger and Leader for nearly 60 years. As a leader and member of Girlguiding, I have attended many church parades but at no time was I forced to go.

On every **Remembrance Sunday Beckenham Division Girl Guides lay a poppy wreath at the war memorial in Beckenham on behalf of all the members of Girlguiding in Beckenham Division.**

This includes the units who meet at Penge Congregational Church.

It is performed as a loving act of remembrance for all those who sadly lost their lives in wars and conflict.
